Sabuna ma pam'ssihan tinangkaw h'ndana si Dampāt.




Si Agasi bay anangkaw h'nda si Dah'kka.

Yuk si Iklug, "Dah'kka, paingga ka?"


Yuk si Dah'kka, "Angurul aku h'ndaku."

Yuk si Iklug, "Pabeya'un aku."


"Aho'," sambung si Dah'kka.
